RESOLUTION #2022-35

IN THE MATTER OF SUNSETTING THE LOCAL DECLARATION OF A STATE OF EMERGENCY IN COLUMBIA COUNTY DUE TO THE COVID-19 FLU VIRUS OUTBREAK

WHEREAS, on February 29, 2020, Governor Jay Inslee declared a state of emergency in Washington state in response to the continued and growing threat presented by COVID-19, a new strain on coronavirus that can easily be spread from person to person; and

WHEREAS, the governor's proclamation, Proclamation 20-05, covered all 39 counties; and

WHEREAS, on March 9, 2020, the Columbia County Board of County Commissioners declared a local state of emergency via Resolution #2020-16 in response to the detection of COVID-19 in Columbia County; and


WHEREAS, on October 31, 2022, Governor Jay Inslee declared the state of emergency in all 39 counties be lifted.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that the Columbia County Board of County Commissioners hereby sunsets, effective November 1, 2022, Columbia County's local declaration of a state of emergency via Resolution #2020-16; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Columbia County's state of emergency is no longer in force and in effect as of November 1, 2022.


