If your work involves altering the existing structure of the road, upon completion you must restore the road to its state immediately prior to your work. Failure to do so will result in the County billing you for that restoration.

By signing, you agree to hold the County harmless in any litigation brought as a result of your permitted work. In addition, if you violate the terms and stipulations of this agreement, the County has the right to revoke your access to right-of-way with notice.
